# **Question Types & Strategies**

- 1. **Spelling from Images**: Practice with flashcards.
- 2. Antonyms/Synonyms: Create word pairs (happy/joy, big/small).
- 3. Missing Letters: Break words into syllables (HAB-I-TAT).
- 4. Scrambled Words: Look for prefixes/suffixes first.

Pro Tip: Use mnemonics! E.g., "Rhythm Has Your Two Hips Moving" for "RHYTHM."
